



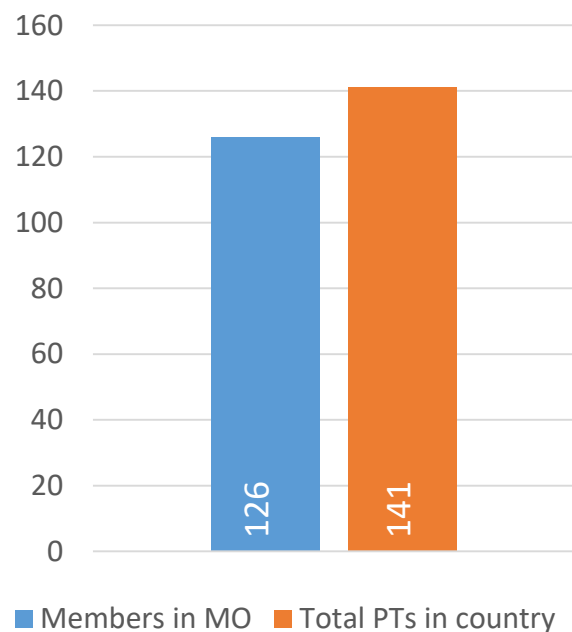

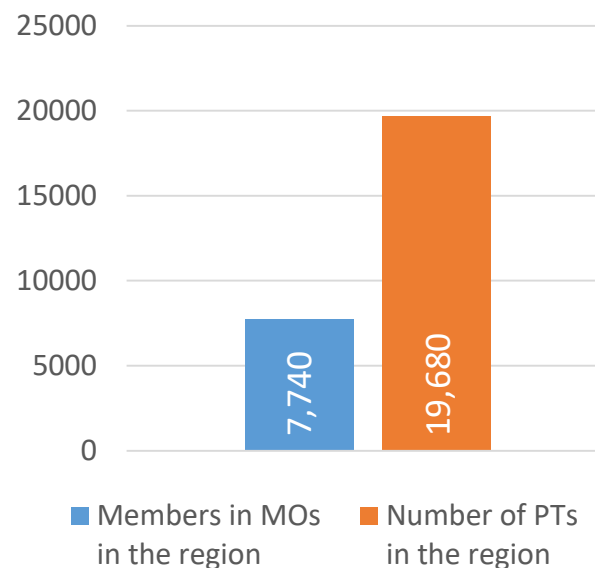

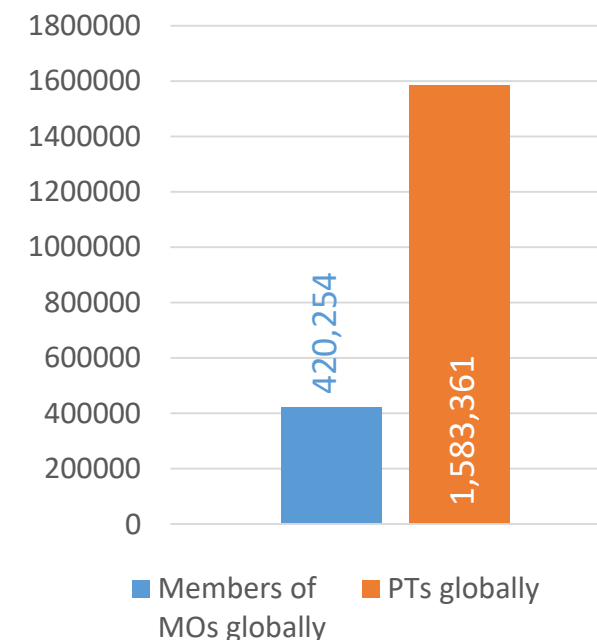
89.3% of PTs in the country are members of the Namibian Society of Physiotherapy

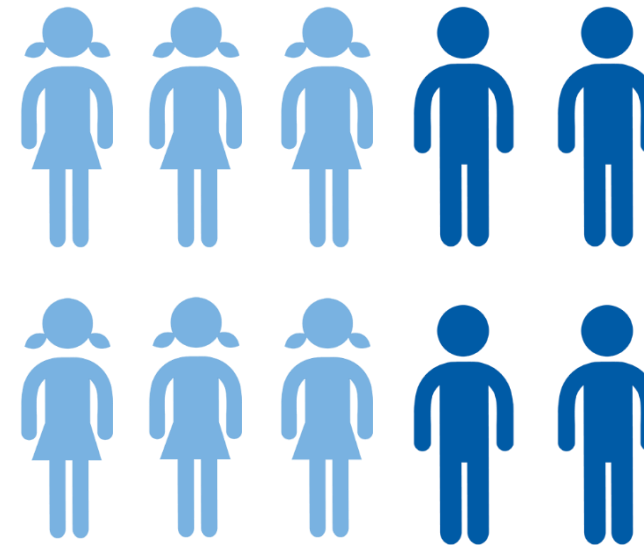

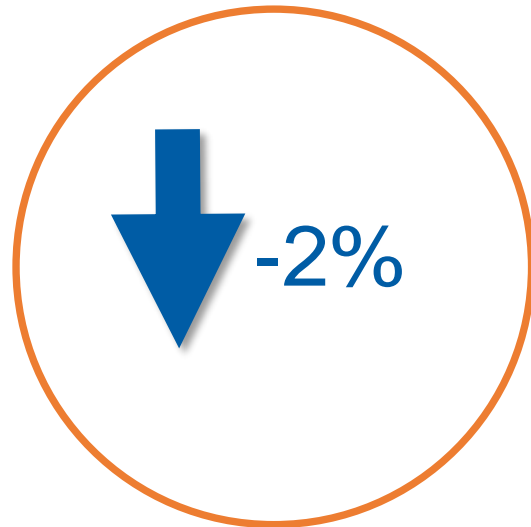

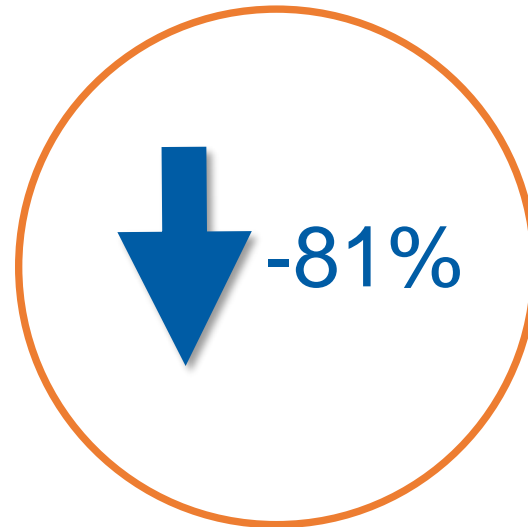

PERCENTAGE INCREASE/DECLINE IN MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS SINCE 2017 SURVEY

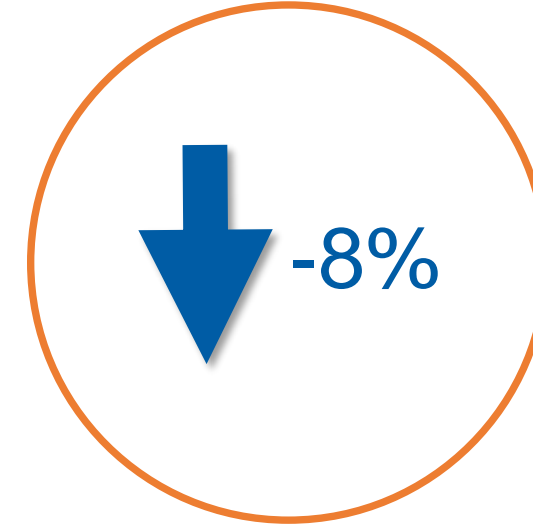

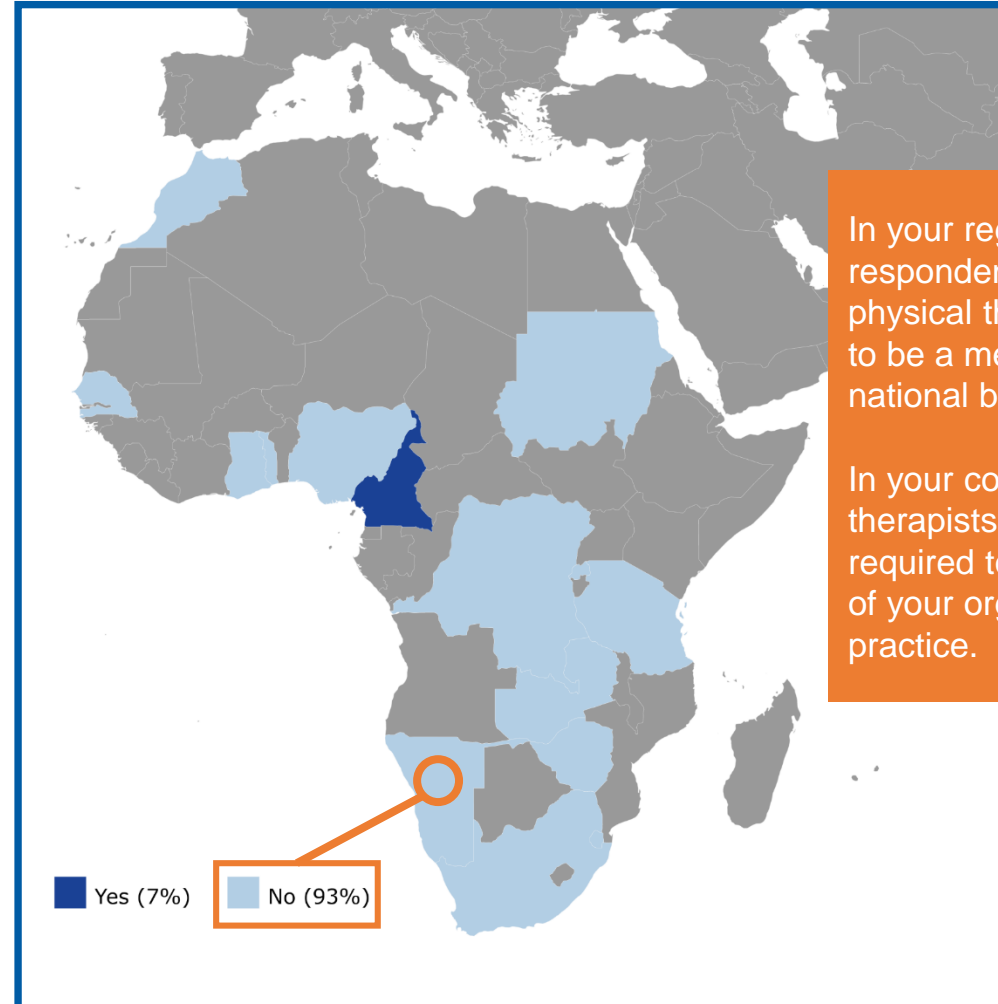
In your region 87% of respondents reported that registration is required to practice.
